Mural painting with Förorten i Centrum, Dubelyoo and Sir Tom Foolery

O Saturday 27/10 – Wednesday 31/10, 14.00 – 20.00. Opening Thursday 1/11, 18.00 – 20.00.

Förorten i Centrum will be responsible for the artistic leadership in the creation of a mural painting in Blå Huset in Tensta. Along with Atlanta artists Sir Tom Foolery and Dubelyoo they invite children, youth and adults to contribute with their ideas and stories and participate in the creation of an indoor collective mural painting. After five days of painting, the goal is to have filled an entire white wall with the imagery and stories of the participants. Material and artistic guidance will be provided by Förorten i Centrum's Artistic Director Saadia Hussein, as well as Dubelyoo and Sir Tom Foolery. The finished mural will be revealed during an opening on Thursday Nov 1st.



Breakdancing workshop and talk with Burn Unit and FICA

Local Capoeira group FICA – Capoeira Angola Tensta will host a workshop with dancers from breakdancing crew Burn Unit, as well as a talk. Capoeira shares historic roots with hip hop-culture. Just like in Capoeira, breakdancing uses common codes and through the flow of rhythm, rhymes and interaction between the dancers are each dancer's athletic abilities put to the test in the middle of the ring, in an effort to impress with one's own style of dancing. Everyone is welcome to participate in the workshop, but a small group of young people from the Järva area (Tensta-Rinkeby-Akalla-Husby-Kista) will be selected to take part in a closed rehearsal the upcoming day, that leads up to a performance during Creative Call LIVE (see event description below).

The 15 Project: Fahamu Pecou's live talk show takes the cultural temperature on Sweden



Vision

Creative Call: ATLxSTHLM is a festival, as well as a growing transatlantic network of individuals, institutions and organizations who support Creative Call's core ideas about art and culture as a tool for empowerment and social change. The home base in Stockholm lies in the suburban areas Tensta and Husby, and branches out to established inner city institutions Kulturhuset and Moderna Muséet. We want to build a strong relationship between Sweden and the American South in the cultural and social arena!

To progress as local communities, cities or countries in a world where social problems and structures have no national borders, it is important to create platforms that allow for local problems to be put in a global context. Through debates, lectures and informal meetings, we wish to promote international dialogue between Sweden and the American South surrounding topics of art, culture, social struggles and cultural stereotypes.

With the festival week in Stockholm as a starting point, Creative Call has aspirations to become a movement with a continuous presence within the spheres of creative culture on local and global levels. 

The artists



DJ Lord

DJ Lord is recognized as one of the world's top turntablists. In 1999, he replaced Public Enemy's legendary DJ Terminator X, joining them in their 40th World Tour that same year. Quickly recognized for his impressive talents, he was soon granted a solo segment in the Public Enemy show. When not touring with Public Enemy, Lord tours solo and is a major player in the drum & bass, as well as the hip-hop, arena. In addition, he tours with Flavor Flav and with the traveling art exhibition Art, Beats + Lyrics. A documentary-DJ Lord: The Turntable Chronicles—focusing on his life and the art of turntabilism was released in 2004. Visit Lord's website.



Dubelyoo

This designer, illustrator and painter considers his work an expression of the relationship between hip hop and pop culture. His work ranges from apparel and logo designs to mural paintings and public art projects, and everything in between. He bridges the traditional commercial and fine art divide by also showing his paintings and graphic works in galleries in both solo and group shows, including Art Basel Miami. Dubelyoo also produces art exhibitions and events such as Gentlemen Jack's Arts, Beats + Lyrics, which is currently the largest traveling urban art exhibitions in the U.S. Creative Call brings Dubelyoo to Sweden for the first time. Fahamu Pecou

Fahamu Pecou works with painting, video and performance-based art that comments on contemporary hip-hop culture. Fascinated with branding strategies used in the marketing of hip hop, but also with popular culture's obsession with celebrity worship, Pecou began experimenting with these ideas and how they related to or supported stereotypes of black males. Often using himself as a model in his artworks, Pecou seeks to challenge social expectations of black male-ness and distort the assumptions we make about one another. His work has been featured in both solo and group shows in the U.S. and abroad, including South Africa, Switzerland and Paris. Creative Call brings Fahamu to Sweden for the first time. Tommy Lee a.k.a. Sir Tom Foolery

This young and rising artist creates paintings that combine images and icons from popular culture and historical events to open discussions about complex issues surrounding society, culture and race. His recent Humble Pie Tour was a collaborative art project and road trip across the three southern states of North Carolina, Georgia and Florida. Featuring a traveling and evolving mural, Sir Tom Foolery used the surface of a trail car as a canvas. Artists he encountered along his journey, including Fahamu Pecou, contributed to the mural and its theme of freedom. Creative Call brings Tommy to Sweden for the first time. Visit Tommy's website.




Burn Unit




Johanna Tysk
